



Neonatal Medical Transport Fellows

Paediatric trainees should have completed a minimum of 6-9 months in a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Emergency Medicine, Intensive Care or Anaesthetic trainees are encouraged to discuss their suitability for these positions. NETS (Victoria) supports a safe working hours policy, ensuring ample time for study, research or recreation.

NETS (Victoria) undertakes more than 1100 primary retrievals per year by road, fixed wing aircraft or helicopter.

Training in Neonatal Transport Medicine and General Neonatology will be provided. More senior appointees will be expected to develop research projects.

NETS (Victoria) is based at Australia's largest Perinatal Centre, The Royal Women's Hospital (RWH). There is an excellent relationship between NETS, RWH and the nearby Royal Children's Hospital (RCH) that allows NETS Transport Fellows free access to the extensive academic and clinical resources of both RWH and RCH.

In addition the Transport Fellow position can be combined with Clinical or Research Fellowship positions in Neonatology at these hospitals.
