I am aware that my child needs to be restrained in the car at all times, and accept responsibility for ensuring that this is done in accordance with the instructions for the chosen option.

The restraint issued only to be used by Peter in accordance wit the prescriber's instructions. I understand no further modifications to the restraint should take place without reference to the person who prescribed the modification.
