Keynote Speakers

- **Dr Crispin Day** is currently the Head of the Centre for Parent and Child Support, Maudsley Hospital, UK. Crispin is a clinical psychologist who has worked as a clinician, manager and researcher in adult and child mental health. Within the Centre for Parent and Child Support, he leads the research, development and dissemination of the Family Partnership Model, the Helping Families Programme and Empowering Parents, Empowering Communities. He leads a broad programme at the CAMHS Research Unit to improve the outcomes, quality and efficiency of mental health service for children and families.
- **Associate Professor. Roger Dunston** joined the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (FASS) at the University of Technology, Sydney in early 2007. He is a senior health services manager, educator and health policy analyst with over 30 years of experience within the health sector. Dr Dunston is primarily located as part of the Centre for Research and Learning in Change and will focus on the development of new forms of collaboration - engagement, research and educational development - between FASS/UTS and the health sector.

Also sharing insights about working with the family partnership model will be Paul Prichard, Training Manager, Royal Children's Hospital Centre for Community Child Health Sharon Gorton, Education Coordinator, QEC Early Parenting Centre and Ms. Nikki Maxfield Tasmania and Dr. Dianne Jackson, CEO Connect Child and Family Services, NSW, followed by a panel session with all the speakers.
