Welcome to the second edition of the Linking Schools and Early Years project newsletter. As the project moves forward some exciting activities are being delivered in each the three project sites. In this edition you will find information on the progress of the project and what's up next for everyone involved in Linking Schools and Early Years and those hoping to learn from it.

What is the project working towards?

The Linking Schools and Early Years Project has been established with the aim that schools are prepared for children of all abilities and backgrounds when they first attend, and that families, services and communities are ready to support the development of children, so that:

All children enter the formal education system ready to engage and be successful

What are the project goals?

There are three specific goals for the project;

- Children and families transition smoothly between early years services and schools.
- Early years services and schools actively connect with families.
- Schools are responsive to the individual learning needs of all children.

What's been happening?



Corio/Norlane Working Group planning local activities

In **Corio/Norlane** – After a 6 month development period the Phase I Action Plan has now been finalized and activity delivery is about to begin. The Corio/Norlane Partnership Group has chosen to support the







implementation of a locally developed Transition Kit as one of their project activities. It is anticipated that the Transition Kit will be on the ground in schools and early education and care services by January 2009.

A buzz of activities have been happening in the other project sites since our last newsletter. Some of the activities currently being put in place by the local Partnership Groups for each project goal are:

Goal 1: Children and families transition smoothly between early years services and schools:

In **Hastings and FootsCray** – childcare, kinder and prep teachers have been spending a day in each others services to build a shared understanding of each others practices. Some quotes following their visits:

Visiting each other's workplaces has also highlighted the opportunity for resource sharing. For example Hastings Primary School is now helping establish a library at Hastings Pre-school, by sharing books from their school library.

Goal 2: Early years services and schools actively connect with families:

Each primary school in **Hastings** has been busy organizing and running family activities at their school. The activities are all different but share





the common aim of making schools a familiar and welcoming environment where families and children feel comfortable

Hastings Primary School had a great turn out for their May "Arts Expo" evening – a night of celebrating the arts and getting in touch with your artistic side, with mask making and a talent show.

St Mary's Primary School, have established a facilitated playgroup for current and incoming families. The playgroup is about providing activities for the children, as well as an opportunity for the existing and new families to soicialise and get to know school staff.

Hastings West Park has invited both school families and families from their neighbouring kindergartens for a story telling and pajama party evening in the school library. This is one of the many great ways they will be celebrating literacy and numeracy week.

Goal 3: Schools are responsive to the individual learning needs of all children:

In **FootsCray** a newly developed Working group will use the findings from the 'Information sharing' forum to investigate ways of sharing information across early education and care services and schools.
