Visit of David Coghill

Professor Coghill leads a Developmental Research Group based at the University of Dundee, Scotland. His research group use psychopharmacological techniques to identify and investigate differences within developmental psychiatric disorders. His research group focuses on disorders such as ADHD and early onset mood disorders and their interaction with environmental factors. The group also recently completed a large study into the effects of stimulant medication on neuropsychological functioning in ADHD and are also currently investigating the neuropsychology of childhood depression. He is involved in several national and international collaborative projects and has strong links to the major scientific ADHD research networks in Europe and the US.
