



## Data sources

The Changing Children's Chances project capitalises on powerful national datasets. This includes the Longitudinal Study of Australian Children (LSAC) and the Person Level Integrated Data Asset (PLIDA).



### LSAC

LSAC is a nationally representative cohort study that examines a broad range of research questions about development and wellbeing over the life course. It includes topics such as parenting, family, peers, education, childcare and health. Data are collected from two cohorts (birth cohort and kindergarten cohort) every two years.
