

Thank you for your recent referrals and work in refugee screening. We are seeing variation in tests completed, and hoping to ensure screening is consistent with the new ASID refugee guidelines.

The following tests are recommended for **adults** arriving in Australia as refugees/asylum seekers. Please see the full guidelines (and RACGP preventive health guidelines) for other areas of screening.

	<pre>'contact history' on IGRA request Varicella serology (to determine vaccination)</pre>

Risk- based	Ferritin - women, men with risk factors Vitamin D - lack of sun, dark skin, covered
buseu	Active B12 - arrived <6 months, vegan, food insecurity, Bhutan, Afghanistan, Iran, Africa
	Rubella serology - women childbearing age
	Syphilis serology - if risk factors
	Chlamydia/gonorrhoea - NAAT urine/low vaginal swabs - if risk factors Helicobacter pylori faecal antigen if upper gastrointestinal symptoms or family history gastric cancer
Country- based	Schistosoma serology - endemic - Africa, Burma, Iraq and Syria - not other Middle Eastern or Asian countries
	<b>Malaria</b> arrival <3 months endemic area (<12 months if fever) - Africa (except Egypt), Burma, Bhutan, India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka- <i>not Middle East</i>
	<b>Hepatitis C</b> - <b>HCVAb</b> - endemic - Congo, Egypt, Iraq, Pakistan, consider in Syrians - not other African/Middle Eastern or Asian countries
Other	Lipids - ≥45 years, frequency varies with risk (RACGP 8.3)
	<b>Diabetes - BSL or HbA1C</b> - $\geq$ 40 years if high risk, each 3 years ( <u>RACGP 8.4</u> ) <b>Albumin:creatinine ratio and eGFR</b> - $\geq$ 30 years if high risk for renal disease, each
	1-2 years ( <u>RACGP 8.6</u> ) <b>FOBT</b> - ≥50 years if low risk, each 2 years, extra screening high risk (RACGP 9.2)
	Mammogram - women 50-74 years, each 2 years; ≥40 years if first degree relative <50 years at diagnosis (RACGP 9.3)
	HPV test - women - ≥25 years to 70-74 years, each 5 years (RACGP 9.5)
