

Thank you for your recent referrals and work in refugee screening. We are seeing variation in tests completed, and hoping to ensure screening is consistent with the new ASID refugee guidelines. The following tests are recommended for children arriving in Australia as refugees/asylum seekers:

- **FBE/film**
- **Ferritin**
- **Hepatitis B serology** - HBsAg, HBsAb and HBcAb
- **Strongyloides** serology
- **Tuberculosis screening** - tuberculin skin test (TST) or IGRA. TST preferred if <5 years.
- **Faecal specimen** - OCP
- **Schistosoma** serology - endemic - Africa, Burma, Iraq and Syria - *not other Middle Eastern or Asian countries*
- **Malaria** arrival <3m endemic area - Africa (except Egypt), Burma, Bhutan, India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka- *not Middle East*
- **Hepatitis C** - HCVAbs - endemic - Congo, Egypt, Iraq, Pakistan, consider in Syrians - *not other African/Middle Eastern or Asian countries*
- **Vitamin D, calcium, phosphate, ALP** - if risk factors
- **Varicella serology** (age 14 years and older to determine vaccination)
- **STI screening** (HIV, syphilis, urine NAAT chlamydia/gonorrhoea) if risk factors - note unaccompanied minors should be screened for HIV and syphilis routinely
- **Nutrition screening** if low weight for age, poor food access, vegan
- **TFT/blood lead** if developmental issues
- **Helicobacter pylori faecal antigen** if upper gastrointestinal symptoms
- **Others - based on clinical findings as needed**
