# HOME VISION TEST INSTRUCTIONS



#### Equipment you will need:

- 1 Visual Acuity Chart
  - **PRINT THE CHART on ACTUAL SIZE settings on your printer and measure it to make sure the size is correct.** It should be 6.4cm or 64mm between the dotted lines
- 2 Paperclips or sticky tape to fasten the chart in a box shape once you have folded it
- 1 Matching Card for your child to use if they do not know the names of the letters
- A tape-measure to measure the 3 meter testing distance from your child to the vision chart
- Something to cover your child's eye with so you can measure one eye at a time.
  You can use an eye patch, a tissue, some paper or material folded into a triangle
- Recording sheet please write the vision test results on the included results form

### If your child wears glasses: Keep glasses on for the test

#### Before you start:

- Find a quiet, well lit room to do the test in
- Put a chair for your child to sit on 3m from where you will stand with the vision chart
  Make sure your child is not facing a window as this could make it hard to see the chart
- Make sure your child understands the test by practicing with both eyes open first
  - Stand close to your child, point to one letter at a time on the vision chart and ask your child to say the names of the letters out loud
  - If your child does not know the names of the letters use the matching card.
    - Check understanding by pointing to the letters on the chart again, this time asking your child to "point to the same letter on their matching card"

#### Start Testing:

- 1. Cover your child's eye
  - a. Place the patch under the glasses on your child's skin if wearing glasses
  - b. Make sure there are no peep holes especially on bridge of nose
- 2. Stand with the vision chart 3m from your seated child
- 3. Using one side of the vision chart, point to the biggest letter first, moving down to a smaller letter each time your child gets the letter correct
- 4. Do not give your child any hints or say the names of the letters. It is ok if they can't see the letter.
- 5. Keep track of the number beside the smallest letter your child can see correctly
- 6. Still testing the same eye, turn the chart around to use a different set of letters, and check to see if your child can see down to the same size letter. Your child needs to correctly see 3 letters of the same size. If they can't, try with letters one size bigger
- 7. In the results section on the back of this page Record the number beside the smallest size letters your child saw correctly 3 times. Make sure you record the results beside the eye you have just tested this is the eye that did not have the patch on.
- 8. Repeat the process from number 1 to 7 with the patch on the other eye
