- Use VICTOR charts to assess normal vitals for age.
- Assess GCS for every child.
- Support family of an unwell child being transferred.



Airway: Ensure patient airway safety

- 1. Assess airway stability.
- 2. ETT patent, secure, position confirmed.
- 3. ETCO2 continuous monitoring.
- 4. Sedation and / or paralyisis adequate.



Breathing: optimise oxygenation

- 1. Observe respiratory rate & character (VICTOR chart for age).
- 2. Sp02 monitored and optimised >92% / blood gas reviewed.
- 3. Administer oxygen using appropriate device.
- 4. Ensure ventilation settings appropriate.



Circulation: ensure IV access, optimise HR & BP

- 1. Ensure IV access secure and patent.
- 2. Consider Intraosseus access where IV access difficult.
- 3. Secure any CVC / arterial lines.
- 4. NIBP / arterial BP appropriately optimised for age (VICTOR charts).
- 5. IDC and orogastric / nasogastric tube.
- 6. Check blood sugar.
- 7. Monitor temperature and prevent heat loss.
- 8. Prepare medications for transport (Monash Emergency Medication handbook).



Documents and Departure

- 1. Ensure documentation complete.
- 2. Include referral letter and copies of all patient charts and NOK details.
- 3. Include Investigation and imaging results.
- 4. Provide access to original images either by CD or by hub and spoke.
- 5. Ensure belongings are managed and family engaged.
- 6. Note that family may not always be able to travel with their child.



Equipment Check

- 1. Oxygen and infusions sufficient for transport.
- 2. Equipment plugged in and batteries sufficient.
- 3. Put gastric tube on drainage and empty drainage bags.

ALERT: Call PIPER Clinician:

If Patient deteriorates.

The need for intervention eg intubation.
