

# Accessing online journals

## Library journals database

The Library's online [journals database](#) shows both print and online holdings. Search for a specific journal title using a full title, partial title, or a standard title abbreviation.

Search for a journal title.

Toggle between *detail view* and *table view* to see more or less detail.

Select the title to go to the full Menu page for more options, or select the provider to go directly to their website.

Check availability from different sources, including what's on the shelf in the Library.

Select a title link from your search results to go to the full Menu page ...

Check availability from multiple sources to match the year or volume you wish to find.

A journal may have changed its name. Check here for older or newer issues, online and in print, that are not displayed above.

You may find similar access or older issues on the Library shelves.

Can't find what you want? Order Document Delivery online (registration required, costs apply).

When in doubt, [Ask a Librarian](#).

If input boxes are present, add the year, volume, and page number of a specific article.

Or you can leave them blank and just hit Go, then navigate to articles at the landing website.

# Accessing online journals

## Alternatives to the journals database

### Browzine

BrowZine is a journal platform aimed at keeping you up to date with the latest issues of all your favourite journals. The app is fully integrated with the Library's journal database, which ensures you see only those titles where access is available.

#### Features

- When combined with the browser extension LibKey Nomad you can get one-click access to our subscribed online journal content.
- Find titles by subject, alphabetically, or sorted by SCImago Journal Rank.
- Use *My Bookshelf* to follow titles of interest and be notified when new articles are published (by creating a free user account).
- Access journals from the web, or on iOS and Android tablets and smart phones.
- See your saved content on any device when logged in.
- Read saved Articles offline (on mobile devices).
- Send references to your bibliographic management program, such as Endnote.
- Share citations with colleagues via email, Facebook, or Twitter.



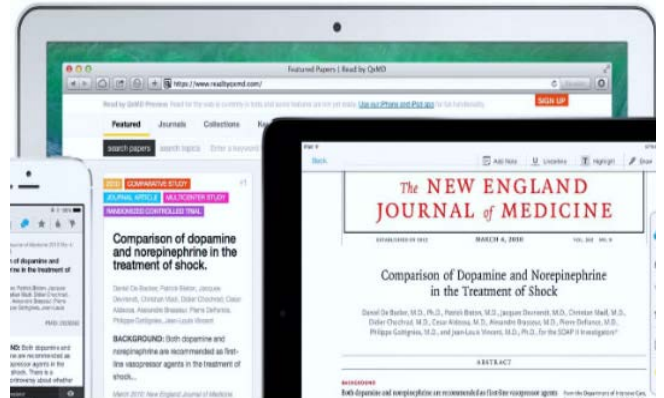
### Read by QxMD

Read by QxMD provides a single place for you to keep up with new research, topics of interest in your chosen specialty, and the latest articles from your favourite journals.

This free iOS, Android and web app provides a simple interface that provides quick access to the medical literature by connecting you to RCH Library subscribed content on the go.

#### Features

- Keep up with the latest new research.
- Search millions of articles from PubMed and Read's database of topic reviews.
- Access full text through our institutional subscriptions and OpenAthens, or via open access publishers.
- Read your favourite journals or browse article collections.
- Visual indicator to see which articles are available through our institutional subscriptions.
- Organize, review, and publish your personal article collections.



## Remote access

Off-site access to journals and ebooks requires an OpenAthens login.
