		 Check that folding parts have latches that lock securely and cannot be undone by a baby.
		 Check that the playpen has no sharp fittings or parts that might snag clothing—this can be a strangulation hazard.
		 As a guide, check that the playpen is more than 500 mm high and the spaces between the side bars are between 50 mm and 95 mm—larger gaps can trap a child's head.
