4.4.3 Promote comfort of the child

Depending on the expected degree of physical pain resulting from the medical procedure

analgesic therapy incorporating the use of paracetamol, non-steroidal anti-inflammatories

and/or opioids may be required.

For particularly invasive procedures, regional or general anaesthesia may be appropriate.

Consider procedural sedation if [10]:

• Severe pain or pain-related distress is expected to result from the medical

procedure.

Prolonged immobilisation is needed to undertake the medical procedure.
