# **GRIPS Full Day Program**

Come to GRIPS (Group Response to Illness in Paediatric Simulation) and learn how to manage the deteriorating paediatric patient in various clinical situations.

This full day course runs from 08:00-17:00 and will focus around the patient who has been admitted to the ward and deteriorates over a period of time.

Participants will concentrate on the recognition and management of the deteriorating patient with training around human factors to improve team work and clinical decision making.

The course includes:
