The Royal Children's Hospital (RCH) has cared for the children and young people of Victoria since it was founded in 1870. As a tertiary and quaternary centre, the RCH cares for the most critically ill and medically complex paediatric patients in Victoria. In addition to providing a full range of clinical services, the hospital also supports many health promotion and prevention programs. With more than 6,000 staff, 12 wards and 350 beds, the RCH is the major specialist paediatric hospital in Victoria, and also provides care for children and young people from Tasmania, southern New South Wales and other states around Australia and overseas.

We are the state's busiest paediatric Emergency Department, often experiencing more than 300 presentations on any given day. The RCH is committed to working with health services across the state and plays a significant role in many critical state and nationwide services. We work collaboratively with hospitals to deliver the right care, in the right place, at the right time, for the benefit of all Victorian children. In April 2016, the RCH became the first Australian hospital to implement the world-leading 'Epic' electronic medical record (EMR). RCH has a strong focus on supporting the successful delivery of the Parkville Connecting Care program – a shared EMR with the Royal Women's Hospital, The Royal Melbourne Hospital and Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre. ROLE PURPOSE

- Be involved in full time Paediatric Otolaryngology and Head and Neck Surgery services at the Royal Children's Hospital. The conditions treated and the surgery involved includes the full spectrum of Paediatric Otolaryngology disorders;
- To be involved with the ongoing care of the ward patients and attend both clinics and operating theatres under full supervision of the Consultant Otolaryngologists;
- Assist the Administration and booking clerks with clinical information and bookings for theatre and clinics;
- Conduct research: be actively involved in the current audits and there are opportunities supported through the Murdoch Children's Research Institute (MCRI) for basic science research, as well as clinical research through the Royal Children's Hospital and the Melbourne Children's Clinical Trials Centre;
- This is an unaccredited position and is therefore not part of the ASOHNS training program.

- Participate in clinical teaching of medical students
- Maintain personal qualifications in accordance with continuing certification requirements of the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency
