# The Royal Children's Hospital

The Royal Children's Hospital's (RCH) vision is to be a great children's hospital – delivering Great Care, Everywhere.

RCH is located within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct, with more than 45 world-class biomedical organisations and more than 50,000 of the brightest minds working together to make the Precinct number one in the Asia Pacific region for health, education, research, and training. Within this, RCH is also a cornerstone member of the Melbourne Children's Campus, partnering with Murdoch Children's Research Institute, The University of Melbourne Department of Paediatrics and The Royal Children's Hospital Foundation. Each organisation contributes to a paediatric academic health centre which is greater than the sum of its parts.

RCH has cared for the children and young people of Victoria for more than 150 years since it was founded in 1870. A full range of paediatric and adolescent health services are provided plus tertiary and quaternary care for the most critically ill and medically complex patients in Victoria. Tasmania, southern NSW and other states around Australia and overseas. The RCH is the only provider of heart transplant services and CAR T-cell therapy for paediatrics in Australia. RCH is an effective advocate for patients and their families with a particular focus on vulnerable children and increasingly, mental health in young people. The hospital also supports many health promotion and prevention programs. The Hospital has more than 6,000 staff, a budget of \$850M, 12 wards and 350 beds. Annually, the RCH has 300,000+ Specialist Clinic appointments, 90,000+ Emergency Department presentations and 20,000 elective surgeries.

#### ROLE PURPOSE

The Allied Health Assistant will assist in the smooth running of the Physiotherapy Department through both clinical and non-clinical duties. In the aquatic environment this includes organisation and implementation of aquatic physiotherapy programs for inpatients and outpatients including NDIS clients, and organising and maintaining efficient day-to-day operation of the hospital pool. This may include both direct patient assistance and non-clinical responsibilities. This position is also responsible for providing land based physiotherapy assistance, inpatient and outpatient service to all teams as directed by the physiotherapists of the Physiotherapy Department.

#### KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

### Clinical Aquatic Therapy:

- Assist the Physiotherapists in the provision of aquatic therapy, e.g. monitor clients from the pool deck during therapy sessions, directly assist clients in and around the pool and changing rooms as instructed by the physiotherapist.
- Provide aquatic therapy programs for in-patients and out-patients as referred to this service under the direction of the physiotherapist.
- Prepare equipment for treatment sessions, and implement regular cleaning / maintenance programs for equipment
- Organise and maintain efficient day-to-day operation of the hospital pool, including direct patient assistance.
- To maintain and monitor the cleanliness and safety of the hospital pool in accordance with local protocols, Australian Regulations, DHS and Australian Physiotherapy Association guidelines
- To ensure safe and appropriate entry and exit to the pool and surrounding area for all clients and keep the Physiotherapists informed of all matters relating to the health and safety of patients.
- Book appointments for clients; maintain client records and statistics, as directed by the physiotherapist or manager.
- Maintain supplies of stock items, and assist with evaluation for non-stockorders
- Accurately document assessment and treatment in the relevant medical notes

# Clinical Land Therapy:

- Under the direction of the Physiotherapy staff in the Physiotherapy department, assist in assessment and treatment sessions for designated patients, both inpatient and outpatients
- Independently provide exercise treatment sessions working within framework of supervision as outlined by Department of Health.
- Accurately document and be responsible for taking and collecting respiratory equipment to and from CSSD (Central Surgical Sterilisation Department) on a daily basis
- Manage department equipment and liaise with administration staff when in need of repair by Biomedical Engineering or Engineering under the supervision of the physiotherapy Health Safety Representative
- Assist in the audio-visual assessment of patients and be responsible for editing and copying video footage under the direction of the treating physiotherapist

## Other:

- Liaise with a variety of health professionals, responsible for the patient's management
- Attend department staff meetings and other appropriate department meetings
- Develop knowledge within all areas of physiotherapy through reading, attending appropriate seminars as guided by team leader
- Attend and participate in professional development sessions within the department as appropriate



- Participate in an annual performance development (PDAP) review with the relevant senior staff
- Complete annual pool rescue training and basic life support training as well as other hospital required mandatory training
- Register all patients for data analysis to enable accurate costing and funding
- Participate in committees within the Department and Allied Health directorate as delegated
- Participate in other duties as directed by the Manager of Physiotherapy, Team Leaders or Grade 3 Aquatic Therapist consistent with the employees skill level and classification

### **QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE**

• Certificate 4 – Allied Health Assistance or equivalent qualification

#### Desirable:

- Previous experience working with patients in Hospital or Healthcare environments
- Experience or knowledge of Physiotherapy
- Experience working or interacting with children and adolescents
- Bronze Medallion Life Saving Certificate/Pool Lifeguard Award/Australian swim teaching qualification or similar

## Other Requirements:

- Employees are required to undertake a National Criminal Record Check and a Working with Children Check prior to commencing employment
- Employees are required to complete the online NDIS Worker Orientation Module and hold a clear NDIS Worker Screening Check
- Employees are required to maintain a valid Working with Children's Check throughout their employment
- A current, full drivers licence for the State of Victoria which is appropriate for the type of vehicle being driven, and comply with any restrictions on their licence (e.g. wearing glasses) while undertaking hospital duties (If applicable)
- Employees are required to maintain compliance with RCHs "Staff Immunisation Prevention of Vaccine Preventable Diseases" procedure.
