The Royal Children's Hospital's (RCH) vision is a world where all kids thrive.

RCH is located within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct, with more than 45 world-class biomedical organisations and more than 50,000 of the brightest minds working together to make the Precinct number one in the Asia Pacific region for health, education, research, and training. Within this, RCH is also a cornerstone member of the Melbourne Children's Campus, partnering with Murdoch Children's Research Institute, The University of Melbourne Department of Paediatrics and The Royal Children's Hospital Foundation. Each organisation contributes to a paediatric academic health centre which is greater than the sum of its parts.

ROLE PURPOSE

This position is responsible for accurate and timely clinical coding and indexing of hospital separations, and quality improvement activities related to coding.



KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

Operational

- · Complete coding and indexing of hospital separations in an accurate and timely manner
- Code at an indicative rate of approximately 35 separations per day
- Participation in the National Weighted Activity Unit (NWAU) Optimisation program which is the internal auditing program
- Ensure completeness of the medical record for accurate coding purposes
- Complete relevant fields in the Patient Administration System to ensure coded data accuracy e.g. admission weight, admission criteria, prefixing, and mechanical ventilation hours
- Attend relevant meetings
- Organise and prioritise workload to ensure individual coding Key Performance Indicators are met
- Other duties as directed consistent with the employee's skill level and classification

Teamwork:

- Use communication and interpersonal skills to effectively interact with team members, other staff and external stakeholders
- Work collaboratively and cooperatively with other members of the team to meet monthly coding timelines and review coding quality indicators
- Work effectively as part of the team with direction from Lead Health Information Manager as required

Quality:

- Actively participate in department quality improvement activities related to coding
- Demonstrate understanding and adherence to ICD-10-AM, Australian Coding Standards and department processes and procedures
- Engage in continuing professional development through education and training
