<p>The Royal Children's Hospital's (RCH) vision is <i>a world where all kids thrive</i>.</p> <p>RCH is located within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct, with more than 45 world-class biomedical organisations and more than 50,000 of the brightest minds working together to make the Precinct number one in the Asia Pacific region for health, education, research, and training. Within this, RCH is also a cornerstone member of the Melbourne Children's Campus, partnering with Murdoch Children's Research Institute, The University of Melbourne Department of Paediatrics and The Royal Children's Hospital Foundation. Each organisation contributes to a paediatric academic health centre which is greater than the sum of its parts.</p> <p>RCH has cared for the children and young people of Victoria for more than 150 years since it was founded in 1870. The hospital also supports many health promotion and prevention programs. The Hospital has more than 6,000 staff, a budget of \$850M, 12 wards and 350 beds. ROLE CONTEXT
<p>The Pharmacy Department produces a number of sterile pharmaceutical products. These are predominately antibiotic infusors to facilitate treatment for the Hospital in the Home Program (HiTH), and Parenteral Nutrition solutions.</p>

ROLE PURPOSE
<p>Supporting the Senior Clinical Nutrition and Sterile Unit Pharmacist, they are responsible for assisting with coordinating sterile manufacturing services, quality assurance, training and education of pharmacist and technician staff rotating through the unit. There is a clinical focus on working as part of a multi-disciplinary team within the HiTH and Infectious Diseases teams to provide best care to patients in the HiTH program.</p>
