RCH is located within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct, with more than 45 world-class biomedical organisations and more than 50,000 of the brightest minds working together to make the Precinct number one in the Asia Pacific region for health, education, research, and training. ROLE CONTEXT

The Inventory Supervisor – Perioperative Services will lead a team in ensuring all clinical consumable ordering, replenishment and inventory management practices take place within the Perioperative departments at the Royal Children's hospital, including Operating Theatres, Anaesthetics, CSSD, Cardiology, and Perfusion.

ROLE PURPOSE

The purpose of the Inventory Supervisor is to ensure that that critical medical supplies are readily available to operating theatre and associated departments. The role manages the day-to-day ordering process across all platforms including Coupa and Imprest, to ensure adequate inventory is available within departments. The role will manage warehouse and inventory best practices.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

Inventory & Order Management

- Manage Imprest and Coupa ordering schedules for all perioperative departments to ensure orders are placed within established timeframes.
- Review ordering schedules on a regular basis to ensure critical and high-turnover inventory is maintained
- Ensure barcodes and product labelling is current, Work with purchasing and clinical teams to action product updates and changes.
- Work the supply chain manager and clinical leads in reviewing inventory par levels. Provide clinical staff with the necessary reports and data to make decisions related to inventory
- Implement inventory management best practices (such as stock rotation) in each storeroom with the view to reduce waste in clinical areas.
- Ensure storeroom, bay, shelf, and bin locations have the correct labelling and controls are in place to maintain the storerooms. Implement location catalogues to ensure goods can be found efficiently
- Contribute to projects related to inventory such as item/range rationalisation.
- Analyse and provide feedback on inventory reports; utilise data insights in operational decision making
- Manage back order and open order reports providing lead time notifications to end users and escalating shortage risks to suppliers and / or purchasing teams
- Support duties on the floor to provide support to the team (eg. During staff leave)

Team Management:

- Supervise a team of store-persons, fostering a culture of high performance and continuous improvement.
- Coordinate and delegate tasks to ensure efficient workflow and timely completion of all ordering activities.
- Conduct regular performance reviews, provide constructive feedback, and develop training programs to enhance team skills.
- Ensure cross-training of all staff across all designated areas and functions.
- Assist with the recruitment, training, and onboarding of new staff.
- Ensure adequate staffing levels are maintained in all service areas to meet department demands. Allocate resources accordingly to cover off activities during staff leave.
- Work alongside supply chain management staff to ensure adequate resourcing across the supply chain team. Cover supervisor duties across the group when required to do so (ed. During staff leave).



Stakeholder Collaboration

- Engage with management on projects and initiatives such as inventory and waste reduction
- Drive a continuous improvement mindset with the wider supply chain team. Work with other management staff on process improvements.
- Liaise with and maintain positive working relationships with clinical head of departments and staff

Compliance and Safety:

- Ensure all team activities comply with Hospital policies, industry standards, and regulatory requirements.
- Promote and enforce a safe working environment, conducting regular safety training and audits.
- Investigate and report any safety incidents or near misses, implementing corrective actions as necessary.
- Contribute to workplace health and safety briefings and meetings providing input on safety requirements.
- Assist with contributing to the Supply Chain Team Risk Register and work on actions to mitigate risks.
- Maintain an equipment register with detailed logs of equipment audits and preventative maintenance schedules.



QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Demonstrated proficiency in the use of established administrative processes
- 1-2 years' experience working in inventory and/or warehouse management roles.
- Experience with ordering systems such as FMIS, Coupa and Imprest
- Organisational and planning skills with ability to prioritise workload and competing demands.
- Well-developed verbal communication, interpersonal skills, and attention to detail with the ability to interact with a variety of stakeholders.
- Strong customer service with the demonstrated ability to maintain key working relationships across the organisation and ensuring a high level of service to stakeholders
- Set expectations, delegate effectively and manage a small team

Desirable:

- Perioperative/Operating theatre exposure or experience within a non-clinical focus
- An understanding of the healthcare sector and knowledge of clinical inventory best practices
- Tertiary qualifications and relevant industry experience

- Strong customer service with the demonstrated ability to build and maintain key working relationships across organisation and ensuring a high level of service to customers
- Demonstrated ability to cooperate and work well with others in the pursuit of team goals
- Strong organisational skills
- Well-developed verbal communication and interpersonal skills and attention to detail with the ability to interact with a variety of stakeholders
- Ability to handle confidential and sensitive information with discretion
- Ability to follow standard operating procedures, analyse situation and or information, clearly and accurately communicate information
- Highly developed organisational and planning skills
- Ability to work with initiative, autonomy and as part of a team



OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- Employees are required to maintain a valid Working with Children Check throughout their employment
